

Richard Ryder created the term speciesism in early 1970 and shared the idea with Peter Singer who popularised it in his classic work Animal Liberation 1975 A key figure in the modern animal rights revival Ryder appeared on the first ever televised discussion of animal rights The Lion s Share Scottish Television in December 1970 He further promoted the ideas around speciesism in recorded discussions with Bridget Brophy for the Open University Speciesism is a prejudice like racism or sexism only applied to our attitude to other animals It sees humans as superior to all other species and it sees glamorous rare animals as superior to common ones But to the zoologist every living species is the
